STALKING TROUT IN YELLOWSTONE WITH ALICE OWSLEY


Yellowstone National Park is 3,472 square miles and home to 2,500 miles of running water home to over a dozen distinct species of fish. Alice Owsley's presentation, Stalking Trout in Yellowstone Country will help you plan your next trip to our nation's first national park. She will present technical fly fishing information and discuss tips that will help the seasoned visitor find new destinations and the first time angler to Yellowstone find success. Alice is a year-round resident of the Greater Yellowstone Ecosystem, so expect an enjoyable presentation of the beauty above and below the water's surface.

From battling big tuna in the ocean to tiny trout in mountain streams, there is not much Alice Owsley hasn't done with a fly rod in her hand. She has been a guide in Yellowstone, Montana and Idaho since 2001. Alice Owsley is one of West Yellowstone's most experienced and knowledgeable fly fishing guides. Alice brings her passion for fly fishing to every trip, not only creating memorable experiences for her clients, but also building their angling skills with a sense of fun and adventure.

Alice was born in Salem, Ohio. At the tender age of 8, she picked up her first fly rod and learned to pursue trout on the area's spring creeks. Alice spent much of her youth chasing trout in Ohio and Virginia before moving to Asheville, North Carolina, to study at Warren Wilson College. While still a student, Alice landed her first job in the fly fishing industry at a local fly shop. After graduating, she headed to the Rocky Mountain West in pursuit of any fish that would take a fly. She worked a season in Alaska helping clients catch giant rainbows (while dodging mosquitos and brown bears), then returned to the lower 48 in 2002 to guide on the world-class waters of Greater Yellowstone. Since 2014, Alice has also traveled to fly fishing events around the country to share her knowledge and experience fishing in and around Yellowstone National Park.

Through all her travels, no place or fish held her interest like the many species of trout that inhabit the waters in the Greater Yellowstone region. She loves to explore her backyard, especially during Montana's short summer months. You can often find Alice camping and floating Western rivers, scouting alpine streams and lakes, venturing into the Yellowstone backcountry, or searching for varied species of fish such as grayling, Yellowstone cutthroat, and pike.

Though Greater Yellowstone is her home, Alice is always thinking about her next fishing adventure near or far. She is no stranger to Idaho's Clearwater River steelhead or Montana's Missouri River carp. She has also fished for tarpon, bonefish, permit and other saltwater species throughout the Bahamas, Florida Keys, Belize,




and Mexico. Since 2021, Alice has hosted clients on guided trips to the Louisiana coast—one of the nation's premier destinations for redfish.

Under Alice's instruction, clients can look forward to learning new fly fishing techniques and strengthening their angling skills. Alice is an award-winning caster who enjoys teaching clients tricks with the fly rod like reach casts, tuck casts and how to properly present a fly when Montana's afternoon winds begin to blow.

Alice has spent her winters since 2002 as a snow coach and cross-country ski guide in Yellowstone National Park. Over her years guiding Yellowstone in both summer and winter, she has accumulated a wealth of knowledge about the park's history, unique geology, and animal habits. Although she has yet to see Steamboat Geyser in a rare full eruption, she can tell you the eruption intervals of Great Fountain Geyser and what time of year to look for rare orchids in the park. If you want to know about the birds along the riverbanks, Alice is also an experienced birder with a lengthy list of species. Her naturalist background adds even greater detail to her clients' fishing adventures.

Alice believes in setting a positive example by protecting the resources we all rely on. She is an active member of the Trout Unlimited Business Program, which works to protect wild trout streams in Montana and across the nation. She also guides fishing experiences for combat veterans with Warriors and Quiet Waters, and volunteers as a guide with Casting for Recovery—an organization that provides fly fishing retreats for women with breast can-

FISHING REPORT: Pyramid Lake

Pyramid Lake Outing Report, March 10-12th By Steve Schalla

On March 10-12th, Sespe Fly Fishers held an outing to Pyramid Lake. We had a party of six with Matt and Cece Rubin, Ron DePompa, Tim Turpin, Eric Kramer, and , myself Steve Schalla. The lake is renowned for large Lahontan Cutthroats that were planted back into the lake by a program put together by Nevada Fish and Game and the Paiute Indian Nation. Lahontan is the subspecies of Cutthroat trout that live in the lake. Named for Lake Lahontan which existed up until the end of the ice age and eventually turned into numerous smaller lakes in Nevada, California, Oregon, and Utah, many which have now completely dried up. Pyramid Lake became the new home to this giant lake trout. The historic record is 27 lbs.

Most of the fishing is done from shore using fly rods and barbless hooks. There are areas where you can wade and reach deeper drop-offs or there are beaches where you need ladders to stand on and reach further out. Many fish with a two-fly rig and an indicator. Usually, these flies are balanced leeches and midges. Most of the roll casting is about 40 feet but with the right fly lines, this is not a problem. Some prefer to cast a sink-tip and strip in a streamer, like wooly worms, wooly bugger, and tadpole patterns. The lake is heavily fished during Feb – April and the guides like to utilize ladders to claim their "spot". This means getting up at the crack of dawn to start fishing.

Matt Rubin caught the largest fish in our group, 11 pounds and will get a trophy thanks to Eric Kramer. We plan make this an annual trip with the trophy going to the person catching the largest fish each year.
